Major Accomplishments

Developed and implemented a very successful Master of Arts in Teaching degree offering a graduate licensure program through online teaching and distance supervision protocols to non-traditional teaching candidates holding degrees from accredited universities. The market for the M.A.T. has expanded by the third cohort to include a growing number of out-of-state and international students.

Rebranded a dormant Ed.D. program as a primarily online degree with two limited summer periods in residence marketed toward domestic K-12 and international school practitioners.

Implemented an online track for the existing B.S. leading to K-6 licensure; building community college partnerships and residency model field experiences in high-need school districts.

Developed and implemented an online undergraduate certificate in online teaching.

Significantly increased departmental and college revenues through online course and program development.

Developed and implemented a Bachelor of Science in Educational Studies (non-licensure) as an alternative for three student groups: those who begin the licensure program and elect not to complete student teaching, for those students with a primary interest in educational policy studies, and for international students who do not require a domestic teaching license.
